Lee Gold Sorry you are leaving. I promise to always write you long, in-depth comments especially for you. ¶ Von Mises explicitly does not purport to analyse the psychology of human beings. Surely you've read enough by now to understand the delimitation of praxeology. And "the technology of Soviet Russia utilizes without scruple all the results of bourgeois physics, chemistry and biology just as if they were valid for all classes" is a correct statement.
