It's Not SELCon, It's Not Worldcon, IT'S NASFiC III!

So I can get it up again. But can I keep it up? Here it is, the annual *APA-v* collation that I can make. (I still intend to drop in on an NYC collation with minimal warning someday.)

What's happened in the past year? When last I left you, I was recovering from Ex-Fiancee #5. NL12, 13, 14 & 15 have been printed. The Smart Set was buried but has been replaced by New Libertarian Notes & Calendar and has already double the last circulation of SS. Counting the issue I'm working on, NLN&C15.1, four issues so far this year (one more to go!).

Libertarian conferences galore: FoFCon last October where the "return" of *NL* was the big hit, and two Dagny (Sharon) Cons: in November I debated **Don Ernsberged** on the LP to rave reviews and in July I debated **Robert Poole** of *reason* to cries of "where's the blood?" on what's Libertarian these days. (He conceded "not *reason*" and that kind of dampened the conflict, for I agreed.)

The Agorist Institute took its first infantile steps and collected its first little contributions from our Little Donor. Riches still to come but we're registered as a corporation in Arizona, the IRS is looking us over (what we allow them to see), and then comes the cheapo mailing permit. The "tip of the iceberg of the Counter-Economy" should be ready for big bucks, offices and staffs, academic journals and the Good Stuff early in 1986. So far signed up for the Founding Advisory Board (big names to attract others): Murray N. Rothbard, Robert LeFevre, Robert Kephart and (almost) Daniel Rosenthal. Still more to be heard from.

After playing Fan GoH at Coppercon last October and LosCon (*yawn*) in November, I remained fanfallow until February when Jared Lobdell (Tolkien pro, National Review writer, economist, NL contributor and AI academic member, as well as budding fan) lured

me to WisCon in the dead of winter. Just as I hit New York in 1983 during rare good weather and no smog, so I hit Madison (where I was radicalized in 1968–1970 and hadn't seen since) during a mild weekend, no worse than fogged in. WisCon is *not* a partycon (yet) but Jared's trying to get me back again to make it one.

April saw the return of Phoenix's LepreCon closer to its rightful time of year and Con season was on again. June I was lured back to Wisconsin to Milwaukee's X-Con. After a wild Saturday night, post-con, cruising the streets of Oslo (punks looking like blond Chicanos on Whittier Boulevard) with one-half the world's female Austrian economists (**Camille Castorina**, originally of New York), and other from U.S., Sweden and Norway. I returned home to Victor's Tenth Anniversary Anarchovillage Party.
