Rodriguez. I'll kick his butt next week. But human (sentients) have One Right and it remains forever: to Property. ¶ I react to your arguments against Natural Law the way you (properly) reacted to Krel's response to you. "Law" may be an ill-chosen word for an anarchist, but there are patterns in Reality. Or is it the Reality (Natural) part you disagree with? Natural Law is cultural-independent; whoever claimed otherwise? Come to think of it, from whom did you learn your understanding of Natural Law? If Nature follows no patterns, then neither does your brainwaves; i.e., you cannot think (thought = order); i.e., your statements to me are meaningless; hence, self-refuting. This is what is meant by a self-evident proof, O.K.? ¶ "Natural Law nationalism" is nonsense. Nationalism violates several Natural Laws, the most obvious being those in economics.

Sinn O'Fein You scurrilous statist! Robert Nozick's connection to libertarianism is that of a Judas Goat to the herd. How dare you associate this crypto-statist, second-hander, Establishment-titsucker with the noble genius, Ludwig von Mises? § Specific refutations: Nozick's ultra-watery acceptance of some of the more obviously-true libertarian concepts—at the expense of ripping out their Natural-Law roots—shocked only libertarians, not the Academy or other statist intellectuals. "Making libertarian ideas reputable"—making them palatable to the State's court intelligentsia is anathema! They can only achieve that status by dilution, obfuscation, and selling them out Emery Allen Beverin I think I've seen this cartoon elsewhere. If it's of Liberty (modesty forbids my mention of New Libertarian Manifesto) it stands as a limp wrist next to a mailed fist. ¶ "This is why Locke rejected anarchy." But so does Nozick! "Nozick's state of which I'm unaware? develops . . . from free market defense/protection contracts" strikes at the very heart of agorism and Rothbardian proto-agorism. All pro-market anarchies and current freeport minarchies have been statified by external imperial conquest. The market has attacked corrosively the most totalitarian states to eat holes of freedom (e.g., nalevo in the USSR). His claim has no scholarly backing; hence it could have only been motivated by nonscholarly stimulus—Evil ones since it serves Evil. He serves his foul statist masters at Harvard well; no wonder they reward him richly. Tell me, Sinn, how can a fine Irish Republican as yourself support such high Anglo Tory scum as Nozick? ¶ The rest of what you claim he develops was ripped off from early libertarian zines, from early libertarian writers as Rothbard, the Tannehills, the Perkinses, Jarrett Wollstein, Skye D'Aureous & Natalee Hall, Filthy Pierre and maybe even me (he subscribed to NLN for a year. ¶ Finally, Robert Nozick "represents one pole in the libertarian wing today, the minarchists . . . " Really! The minarchist leaders I know, those of proven integrity on the anti-political battlefield, such as Howard Katz, Terry Diamond, Brad Linaweaver and even (borderline case but very minarchist) Toni Nathan, have little respect for Nozick. What has motivated *you* to write this *apologia* for this Quisling of libertarianism? ¶ Note to Arthur et al.: This is our real Enemy, not the silly ravings of the Anarcho-commies. I do a lot of debating and find the printed version of speeches just doesn't transfer media well. ¶ (Ct Moral Hazard) "Holocaust Revisionism" has nothing to do with exonerating anyone, nor is there any timing involved. It's been going on for decades but only picked up steam after the Israeli-tack Phalangist atrocities in Lebanon. I'm surprised, after your neo-Oxonian presentation, that you're blind on WW2 revisionism. ¶ (Ct O'Fein) What do you mean "the rightness of being a boss?" I consider employer-employee relationships obsolete (historically), uneconomic (praxeological), debilitating (psychological), but non-coercive (morally). Is that a position of right or wrong? Finally, do you distinguish between stateless . . .capitalism" and free-market anarchy (agorism)? If not, then you stand challenged. ¶ (Ct Vicki) We travel in different circles, for I have found no anarcholibertarians accepting statist lines on Grenada. Looks like GOS, LRHC is doing good work in Southern California; only the Defence Caucus partyarch wing supports the invasion. ¶ Why do you defend the US by insisting it is a democracy? Sean Haugh Did Lever ask you who Norman Mayer is/was? ¶ Lots of good stuff, comrade! ¶ (Ct Arthur) On Society: not bad. I think of it as a gas with people as interacting particles. Put too much pressure on and it will explode. Turn up the heat and those at the borders will evaporate off. The key is not to anthropomorphize the collection into a Collective—as you rightly point out. ¶ What evidence as "plain as the nose on your face" is available for the proof of systematic extermination by the German State (other than War, like the U.S., Britain, USSR, etc.)? The only response to revisionist challenges that I've seen range from "how dare you bring this up?" to bombthrowing. Let's start with what evidence convinced you of the Holocaust's existence? ¶ (Ct Anni ct Jimmy) "Is persuasion coercive?" And is coercion persuasive? ¶ Vgcst Mike on scarcity vs "free goods economy."

The only nightmare involved is for those bureaucrats who would like to see their Hell perpetuated-tough luck! ¶ Concerning your Heroic Martyrdom for The Cause, steps have been taken to get your an anarchoscholarship. By the way, Northeastern is not a state college, is it? (It'll ruin fundraising.) ¶ On Social Anarchism: Everyone from Rothbard (on his better days) to Nock to Tolstoy to LeFevre (to me!) agree that Anarchists will triumph by role-modeling morality. By the way, I continue to dislike the use of "ethics" as a term for those too chicken to say "morality." If you don't rob me, you're moral. If you do but can excuse it, you're ethical. Screw ethics! ¶ I violently disagree with

Baldelli's false dichotomy between Realist and Idealist, even though (or perhaps because) it is the popular, German-Idealism-derived conception. Long live the Romantic Realist: one who pursues an achievable, worthy Ideal until he or she achieves it or dies trying. Anarchy is achievable, on an individual or small-group basis right now. On the other hand, I find little appealing about your "waterfountain economy." Perhaps it's achievable but I see nothing worthy about it. In other words, what's so Ideal about stagnation? ¶ Anarchy (I continue to dislike anarchism) is not linked to an economic system but it is not freedom, only Statelessness. Complete freedom requires a completely free market-which defines Agorism which defines an 'economic system.' ¶ Most of what I found worthwhile in your summary of Baldelli's ethical capital vs legislation sounds like Our Enemy, The State, fifty years later. Nock called it Society vs The State. Say, why don't we have a fiftieth anniversary celebration of OE, TS? In fact, might be a good idea for NL14 theme issue . . . ¶ I know one of the key founders of the Mackay Society and wonder if he continues to consider himself MLL as his deviations grow. He used to work at the Henry George School in New York City: Mark Sullivan. ¶ Good criticism on their neo-Georgism onland titles but all property is limited i availability or it wouldn't be Property. Chapter One of Man, Economy and State, the "coke trickling down your throat" example! I agree with the rest of your criticisms unreservedly. imagine It suddenly occurs to me who you might be: female, collectivist-deviationist anarchist from Atlanta who's previously contributed. If so, I'm truly surprised that you chickened out into pseudonymity. ¶ I am stunned that a human being could possibly like a Trek movie and dislike the best movie of 1984. It's true that Temple of Doom had a weakness that Raiders did not and I am all for the "Bring Back Marian Ravenwood" movement. But the problem wasn't Capshaw's portrayal (honest enough for the 1930s) but that her character was largely irrelevant. And being irrelevant, why would it make that much difference to the perfection of the rest of the film? And what ra [excuse the typesetter hiccups] racism? ¶ Comparing Dr. Who to *Indian Jones* is absurd, they are different genres (so is *Trek*, for that matter). What attractive male hero? I haven't seen episodes since I left Canada in 1968 but I must have missed something if there is now sex appeal in Dr. Who. ¶ Another point: IJ is ultra-individualistic; ST is statist, though Kirk does turn outlaw in the last film (will they follow through on this, next film?). Dr Who is middle-of-the-road, limited government. Hey, this is just as valid as your attempt to judge action-adventure pulps on the basis of Feminism! ¶ (Ct Octopus) Hmm. I feel a bit mixed reading this tirade (positive term in my lexicon). If you distinguish between the free market and capitalstatism ("capitalism," a term invented by free-market anarchist Thomas Hodgskin and swiped by Marx) then we have little quarrel here. Why can you not understand fervor for the free market but be glad he supports the "underground" economy? What's the difference to you? ¶ Ah, here I disagree: "capitalism inherently leads to statism" in context implies other forms of ideology don't. Hah! Commune-statism (communism) and Syndical-statism (fascism, guild socialism) are not imperialist? Against The Wall and Bill George? *shudder* ¶ (Ct Sean) No. anarchocollectivists obviously do not agree that "anarchy implies thinking and speaking for oneself." Libertarianism and agorism do (ideologies requiring anarchy as a component). By the way, are you aware of the (at least historical) differences between anarchocommunism and anarchosyndicalism and which has proven (on the whole) allies of individualist anarchy and which the common enemy? Do you care? (It may save your life some day.) As long as I'm at it, do you know about the "anarcholiberals" of Jugoslavia (and underground in the Eastern bloc)? Not what you might think. Feel free to ask me to elucidate on anything that's tickled your anarchofancy. (Ct Mike) "Panarchy" as you and Mike use it is community statism, a "limited government" form long advocated by Karl Hess but even he acknowledges the problems. Expulsion isn't the problem (really, if you are where you are by choice, why would you choose to be surrounded by disgusting and disgusted [at you] people?), escape is. The Leviticus-sers can uphold the letter of their law by putting to death any who remain amongst them, and as long as all are free to go, no problem. Here, then, is the overriding law which anarchists must uphold over communitarians: any and all (including "children") must be free to emigrate from a community they have rejected. I have no problems enforcing this (protection agencies with Indiana Jonestype rescuers) but non-agorists might run into unpleasant contradictory choices. If this intercommunal law is upheld, we have communitarian anarchy rather than statism. ¶ I am truly sorry to hear you had a vasectomy and devoutly hope it's reversible. We've had a progressive market (in the long run) since the Dark Ages, even averaging in the Depressions. (See *Human Action* for definitions.) (Yes, I'm edging into a discussion of Counter-Economics.) ¶ You start from a fairly good ideological position, except maybe "restructuring of taxation..." unless you restructure it to oblivion. ¶ Ct = comment to, which comes from your ct Mike. ¶ (Ct Ackner) La Rouche not only does not claim to be a libertarian but denounces us as tools of the Black Guelph conspiracy.

Yarl The Freedomite An hoary old libertarian cliche (I said it in 1970) made into cartoon. Do you do Editorial Cartoons? Comic strips? Superheroes?

Vicki Rosenzweig Bomb your local polling place? Yeah. ¶ You were a member of the Party of the Right? (*awe*) Jared Lobdell has filled me with tales and legends about it. \(\) (Ct Brian H.) Don't want to "burn Christians at the stake or something," eh? Wait till he sees The Wicker Man. ¶ (Ct Brian B.) Another possible market solution to parking: disposable vehicles. (Ecophiliaes, consider yourself taunted.) ¶ (Ct Mike et Darlene) How is God And Man At Yale these days? And woman, now, too? By the way, can you get into Morry's? ¶ (Ct me) Are you serious or did you read our pitch too quickly? ¶ Rockefellers break laws, too. Of course, they get away with it, but so do we. Why not use what tricks of theirs we can scale down? ¶ I'll put you on the list for first membership in AgoraCard. ¶ (Ct Jimmy) "Liberalism was pronounced dead many years ago. It's tenacious." It's still dead, Jim. Also on the critical list: Marxist-Leninism. (See SNLA #2 & #3 for details.) ¶ (Ct RAAG) Actually, Coolidge was, relatively, an interventionist. Now Warren G. Harding, there was a limited governmentalist. ¶ True, but one of the ways to be "flashy and popular" is to be "progressive" if the market demands it. Right now, the rock market is on the side of the post-punk angels . . . ¶ Just noticed a consistent typo. Ct = comment to; hence, comments to is est; not ets. Like mothers-in-law. ¶ (Ct Sean) Hard-core protestants opposed paid clergy, too, such as my Russian ancestors and U.S. Quakers. Of course, it's not the paying they object to, it's having clergy at all. \(\text{(Ct B.) I'm pleased to hear that the Strangely Clothed}\) Assholes (© Arthur Hlavaty 1978, I think) have so diverged from fandom tha Jonathan could be so surprised. Good riddance.

Martin Morse Wooster Robert Poole wore a "Smash The State" T-Shirt? You have witnesses? Photos? Mr. Minarchist, himself? ¶ Poor Ed! Want to do a piece on him for NL? (I knew there was someone we hadn't offended yet! No, I mean Crane's enemies.) ¶ (Ct Elayne) All right! (*take off gloves*) Let's get down! "I'd prefer to see my friends as friends—not as titles, power objects, or sex objects? What's a "friend?" How does it differ from a mass of protoplasm in human shape? Ideas, Martin. (And, even in this APA, those holding your error are Legion.) To me, human beings are a bundle of ideasa quantum bundle of various wavelengths superimposed. Titles, power, and sex characteristics, I'll grant you, are not what I select for either. But many have thrown the following at me: "I don't like/ never use 'labels'." My usual response is, "Let me know when you've decided to resume thinking and we can talk again." Labels are designations of concepts; anti-label = anti-concept = no thought. Where's Arthur? Reagan will be restrained by the Democrat Congress; who'll restrain Mondale? The Republicans? Remember the Goldwater-Johnson campaign and who "kept us out of Viet Nam." Here's the key: no matter who's elected, we do not have to live under Reagan-Bush, Mondale-Ferraro or Bergland-What's-his-name. We can choose to live under anarchy. Reagan has had no effect on my life these past four years except to provide me with a target for my antipolitical writings. ¶ "I've always wanted to have an Italian vice president?' You have a vice-president? You're further gone than even I thought. ¶ I'll skip arguing with you on Bruce Springsteen; you're already undoubtedly convinced I'm Out To Get You. ¶ Hey, you redeemed yourself aesthetically on the Conan The Destroyer question. Good Roy Thomas plot. In fact, I agree with you on every movie you mentioned . . . Strange. ¶ Linda Lovelace is a truly vicious little bithc. First she makes her bundle, then denounces the source to get born-again respectability. She's rightfully infamous in the industry. I'll take Marilyn Chambers any day. ¶ (Ct Mike) "Xtians"

are not the only ones into souls, by the way. In fact, they got most of their thinking on it from the Greeks (pneuma). So feel free to believe in souls without Christianity. (I don't, for what it may be worth.) ¶ You could lose weight eating nothing but lean meat, too. But I think I'll stay out of this round of Animal Rights, save to ask you directly: why fight for the "Rights" of anything that doesn't get up and claim they are oppressed? Surely if you must feel obligated, liberate everyone who wants to be and says so first. Then look for more trouble. ¶ Gct Rick that if we had a free market, we wouldn't need minimum wage laws. Nor would we have a mechanism with which to pass laws. A free market is impossible without anarchy. ¶ You surprise me by admitting you're weak on economics. You could totally blow me away by next telling me you'd done something about it. Another answer to Steinem is to support Nazi and Klan right to make their movies and novels. Then sexual-aggression literature would not be a special case nor would anyone think it "acceptable." Why should anyone assume anything printed or filmed is morally or aesthetically acceptable? A far better first approximation is the exact opposite. Caveat emptor. ¶ Linda Lovelace had all sorts of control over her life, all that counted in this case. It should be quite an expose, since none has been presented by the government or its academic toadies that systematic execution of significant numbers of Jews occurred during the brief years of the Third Reich. The camps existed and so did the work and, undoubtedly, the usual statist mistreatment. Good quote choice. ¶ (Cst me) I think my Roman numeral remark was triggered by you abbreviating my intials but not my Roman III to an Arabic 3 as well, to form my usual fannish tetragram (SEK3). ¶ Wendy McElroy and Sharon Presley are well-known (outside your circle, I guess) libertarian feminists, writers for New Libertarian and friends of mine (though not of each other). Sharon started ALF and directed it for many years. Wendy recently edited a book on feminism, Freedom, Feminism And The

State. (Got into a row with the sponsoring institute by picking antipolitical statements by individualist feminists. Heh, heh.) ¶ (Ct Sean) would be ruled by neither, but if I have to pick one who is 'sincere,' I guess I'd pick Reagan over Gary Hart. The only sincere elected Democrat I ever knew was Lester Maddox. Hart sold out George McGovern and was changing his positions more often than his socks. Well-meaning?
